
Member Project

From Chapter Member Timothy Lunney:

My Revolutionary War Patriot ancestor Elias Taylor and his eldest son John Taylor both died while serving in the Continental Army at Fort Ticonderoga in 1777 and are buried there in a mass grave. There is no grave, marker or memorial for them in Maine. I have offered to provide a Revolutionary War Soldier historical marker at the site of his home in what is now Manchester, Maine. The Manchester Maine Historical Society is verifying the exact location of his home and has offered obtain the necessary permissions from the current property owner and the Town of Manchester for placement of the marker.
